

'We would love for you to join us to celebrate...' So begins a card which has been sitting on our mantlepiece for some months. Isn't it exciting to think that someone wants your presence at a special event or on a special occasion? This particular one is a wedding invitation – and in response Tim and I fly out on Boxing Day to attend our son and his fiancée's wedding in Australia!

Maybe you've had an invitation recently – if not to a wedding, then to a birthday, anniversary or family party. Or simply to go out for a cup of tea – it doesn't have to be a grand affair if 'the pleasure of your company is requested' and you will make the moment better for someone by being there. And then you have to decide – will you go??

This year the Church of England's Christmas theme is 'Follow the Star: The Great Invitation'. It is firstly an invitation to us all to come to a Christmas service – to experience the joy of a Carol service or a Crib service as we sing familiar carols and hear the Nativity story once again; to stay up for Midnight Communion and welcome the birth of the baby Jesus as the shepherds did; or to join in the Christmas morning celebrations of the Good News of God coming to earth as a human child. You can find details of all the Christmas services in our Benefice on our website (www.bromhambenefice.org).

It's also an opportunity to invite someone else to come with you to share the joy and the mystery of the Christmas message – to encourage them that you would be delighted if they would join you (and maybe have a glass of wine or something to eat with you afterwards?). Could this be the opportunity to invite someone back who hasn't been to church for a while - to offer them a warm welcome and your company?

Another part of 'The Great Invitation' is the opportunity to reflect on that theme through a booklet containing a reading, reflection, prayer and action for each day from Christmas Eve through to Epiphany. The booklets will be available at all our services from Dec 11th (suggested donation £1)–or you can get the content delivered free to your inbox by signing up at churchofengland.org/FollowTheStar.

But the most important part of The Great Invitation is that, as Archbishop Justin Welby has written, 'we are all invited to Follow the Star and find out what it is pointing to: the person of Jesus and the light he brings to each of us.' The invitation comes to us from God himself – He requests the pleasure of our company and would love for us to join Him to celebrate the birth of His Son, and to go on learning more about life with Jesus through the year ahead. And we each have to decide – will we go, will we join the party?

Archbishop of Canterbury visits Mozambique and meets Prime Minister and victims of conflict



The Archbishop of Canterbury visited Mozambique on the weekend beginning 21st November in order to meet with people displaced by the conflict that has forced nearly a million to flee their homes.

The Archbishop also visited Mozambique to take part in celebrations for the new Anglican Church of Mozambique and Angola, which became the 42nd province of the Anglican Communion in 2021.

The Archbishop met the Prime Minister of Mozambique, Adriano Maleiane, in the capital city Maputo, and they spoke about the importance of peace, reconciliation and preventing more violence in the country, as well as Mozambique's future potential in terms of natural resources and tourism.

He then flew to the north of the country, to Pemba, where there is an ongoing insurgency. Four thousand people have been killed and nearly a million have fled their homes because of the violence.

In Pemba he met government officials, Christian leaders, Muslim leaders, teenagers and young adults who are involved in reconciliation work. He also visited people who've been displaced by war and are now living with local families in Pemba. Eighty percent of people who are displaced are staying within the local community rather than in IDP camps.

On the Sunday of his visit three thousand people filled

Maputo's Maxaquene Sports Hall for a Eucharist and Thanksgiving Service to mark the creation of the new Anglican Province.

The Church in Mozambique and Angola (IAMA) became a new province in 2021 and is now the 42nd province of the Anglican Communion. In September last year Archbishop Justin led an inauguration service via video link from Lambeth Palace but now covid restrictions have eased he's there in person to mark this milestone. During the six-hour service he also affirmed the Presiding Bishop, Carlos Matsinhe, as the Acting Primate of IAMA, and presented him with the Provincial Cross.

In his sermon, the Archbishop spoke of the shared colonial history of Mozambique and Angola and their struggles for freedom. He spoke about the current peace work being carried out in the north of the country and how communities are standing up against radicalisation.

He said, "This is your treasure to share with the world: the story of reconciliation."

"This province knows the message of 2 Corinthians. We are afflicted in every way but not crushed. Perplexed, but not driven to despair. Persecuted but not forsaken. Struck down but not destroyed."

During his visit, the Archbishop opened a new Anglican church, Sao Marcos da Matola, in the Maputo suburb of Matola.

Ingredients

125 gm butter or marge125 gm soft brown sugar3 large eggs

60ml milk 250gm SR Flour 1 tablespoon mincemeat 2 teaspoons mixed spice.

Put all in a large bowl and beat well. Finally add 400gm mixed fruit and **everyone has a stir**.

Bake in a loaf tin for 45 mins at 160 degrees or we made 24 small cakes to bake in 20 mins.

90 years of broadcasting the Royal Christmas Messages

This year we shall have our first Royal Christmas Message from King Charles III. He follows in a tradition that spans three generations.

It was 90 years ago, on 25th December 1932, that the first Royal Christmas Message was broadcast on radio. King George V addressed the nation live from Sandringham. A quarter of a century later, on 25th December 1957, the Christmas message by Queen Elizabeth II was televised for the first time.

King George V had been asked to broadcast a Christmas message in 1922, but at the time he felt that radio was for entertainment, and therefore not suitable. Ten years later, after a visit to the BBC, he was persuaded otherwise, and agreed to do it as part of the inauguration of the new Empire Service (now the World Service).

The time chosen was 3pm because it was the best time for reaching most countries in the Empire. In fact, the first message started five minutes late and lasted only two and a half minutes, but it made a massive impact and established itself as a regular Christmas Day event.

Edward VIII never delivered a Christmas broadcast, but King George VI continued the tradition, using it to encourage people during the Second World War. Queen Elizabeth II broadcast her first Christmas message in 1952, again from a room at Sandringham, and five years later agreed that her Christmas message could be televised – live. She proved to be a natural broadcaster.

But times changed, and in 1960 the message was pre-recorded from Buckingham Palace, which meant that it could be sent to Commonwealth countries for broadcast at a convenient time. However, the 3pm UK broadcast continued every year –

except 1969, when the Queen wrote a message instead, believing that the Royal Family had received enough exposure with the TV documentary *Royal Family*, which had aired in the summer.

But the tradition was resumed the following year. The Christmas message is now also available each year as a podcast and can be seen through Facebook and YouTube. King Charles III is expected to give his first Christmas message this year. *Tim Lenton*

Canon Paul Hardingham continues his series on the very fundamentals of Christianity.

Christian Basics - No 12: the Return of Jesus

'For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people... while we wait for the blessed hope, the appearing of the glory of our great God and Saviour, Jesus Christ' (Titus 2:11,13-14).

Advent is the time when we focus on the first and second coming of Jesus. He first came as a baby in Bethlehem as our Saviour, 'to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own.' (14), through His cross and resurrection. Now we wait for His return to judge the world and finally put an end to sin and death.

We can understand the relationship of these two events by considering D Day and VE Day in World War 2. D Day marked the allied invasion at the beaches of Normandy on 6th June 1944. It was not the end of the war, but it was a decisive turning point in which victory was assured, although not finally achieved until VE Day on 8th May 1945.

For us, Jesus' death and resurrection marks our D Day, when He secured victory over sin and death. However, only when He returns, will Jesus finally end sin and death and all who have put their trust in Him can share the great victory celebration in heaven.

In Advent we reflect on what it means to live in the time between these key events. Paul says, we need to 'to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age' (12). More troops died in the period between D Day and VE Day than during the rest of the war. Although we live under Christ's victory, we will still struggle with sin and suffering. 

The man who married Mary

The traditional Nativity scene on our Christmas cards has Mary with the Holy Babe. Around her are the shepherds and Magi. We may also see stable animals, angels and a star! While Joseph is often included, his presence seems to be of minor importance.

After all, we praise God for Jesus with our familiar Christmas carols, mentioning angels, shepherds, Wise Men and Mary but the name of Joseph is absent! Why is Joseph given a low profile? For he is a man to be remembered.

Joseph was a resident of Nazareth. He worked as a carpenter and his skills would have included making furniture, repairing buildings and crafting agricultural tools. Although Joseph had an honourable profession, he would not have been a man of great wealth.

The gospel writers Matthew and Luke give Joseph a few brief mentions. After the birth of Jesus, Joseph and Mary go to the temple in Jerusalem to dedicate the Baby to God. Afterwards, they flee into Egypt to escape the wrath of Herod and much later return to Nazareth. 12 years later, Mary and Joseph go with Jesus to Jerusalem for the Passover feast. Here they lose Jesus, only to find Him in the Temple talking with religious leaders!

Apart from these verses, the New Testament is silent about the rest of Joseph's life. However, we do know that Joseph was father to other children by Mary. His four sons are named, and they had at least two daughters. (See Matthew 13:55)

And we also know that Joseph was someone who quietly and humbly took on the awesome role in caring for the early life of the Son of God. Joseph would have taught Jesus many things – not just the skills of a labourer, but the lore of the countryside which was evident in our Lord's teaching. Jesus grew up within a loving family and described God as 'Father', knowing also the good fatherly qualities of Joseph.

In the Christmas story, Joseph is placed into a situation that brought him misunderstanding and suspicion. But Joseph remained faithful in the knowledge that as long as God had spoken, the opinion of others mattered little. Before Jesus began His ministry, it is believed that Joseph died. It is likely Jesus took on many of His father's responsibilities before He left home.

In the eyes of the world, Joseph was a nobody. He was not a man of valour, fame and fortune. But he was the one who had parental responsibility for the greatest person who has ever lived!

It is sad that we often equate ordinariness with ineffectiveness. Down the ages, God has used many ordinary people to accomplish



great things. God continues to use ordinary people. Like Joseph, we need to know that doing God's will is the most important thing in life. May we, this Christmas, respond to God's call to us and please Him in all that we do.

The Holy Family




The clear, simple text is perfect for children just starting to read, and for adults to read aloud to them.
